**Bandsaw Safety**

**Cutting Round Stuff on the Bandsaw**

If you have tried to cut round dowelling or the like on the band saw, you may have had it grabbed and turned on you. This can scare you half to death; draw a piece of you into the blade; twist and ruin the blade; and or ruin the wood. A "C" clamp or "F" clamp will give you a hand hold and a solid point against which the wood cannot turn

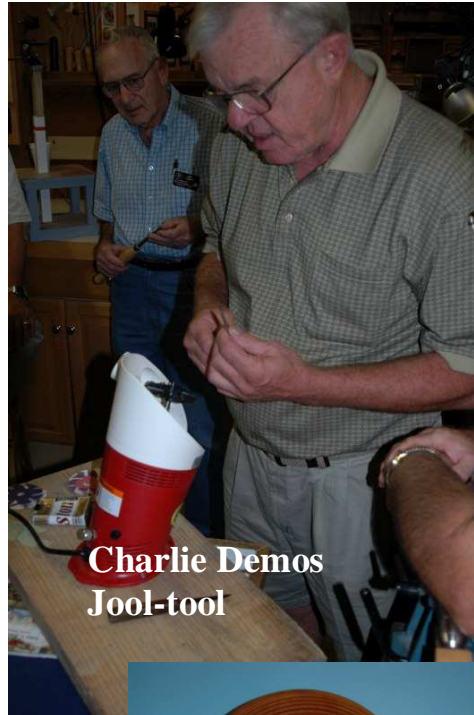
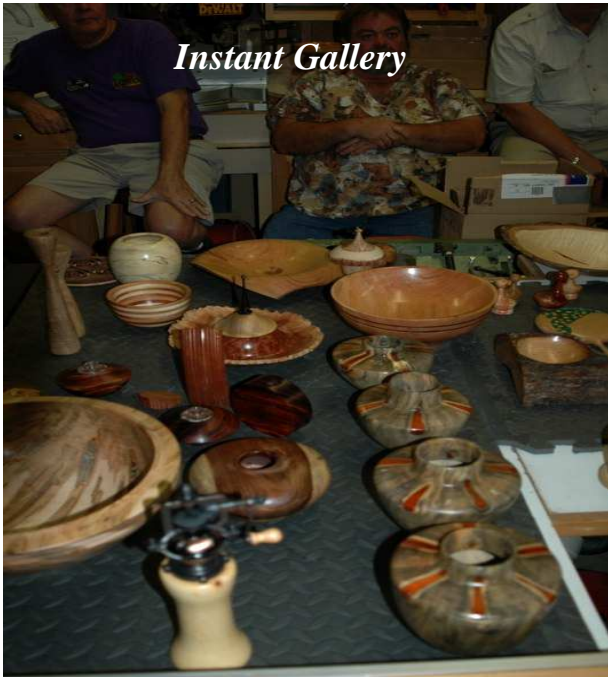
