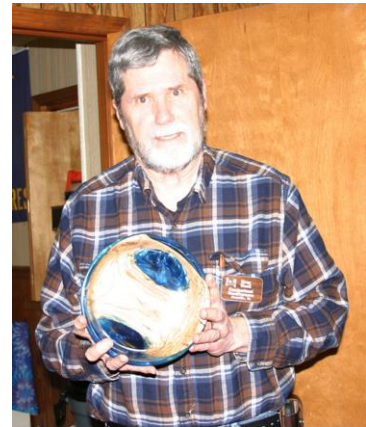
Mystery Box Winner was Tom Neckvatal. He won a beautiful Bowl made by Herman Ledford

Meeting Minutes

Meeting was called to order at 6:00 pm with 37 members present and 1 guest, Dennis Welch and one new member, Dan Katz. Welcome Dan Katz!

Business meeting:

2. Old Business:

- a. Motion to accept the Minutes as published in the February Newsletter was passed.
- b. Motion to accept the Treasurer's report via email in advance of the meeting was Passed. General fund \$4493. Charity \$25.
- c. Dues are due \$50/60. Treasurer accepting payment. The deadline for paying your dues is May.
- c. Thanks to Red Price's hard work the Association is now a Non-Profit 501 3 c.

3. New Business:

- a. The All-Day Saturday External Demos will be by Pat Carroll on 8 August and Sammy Long on 11 July. Demos will be free to club members. A motion was passed to charge non-members \$25 per demo. A sign-up sheet for Sunday Hands-on Classes for both demonstrators was passed around and enough people signed up to have the Sunday Hands-on Demos. Participants will have to cover the cost of the hands-on class.
- b. A motion was passed to formalize the use of electronic votes by members in lieu of in- person voting. At least 10% of the members must vote if it is by electronic means for the vote to be accepted.
- c. A motion was passed to re-affirm the authority of the Board to decide time critical issues between normal meetings.
- d. The club has been awarded a full tuition scholarship to Arrowmont for a week-long class. We have already allocated \$500 towards room and board in our budget. A motion was passed to conduct a raffle at \$10 per ticket, one ticket per person, for attending the class. The winner will have to commit to teaching the club what he learns by giving a demo within 6 months of attending the class. Congratulations to Tim Audette for winning the scholarship!
- e. The Committee of Billy Dodd and Tom Neckvatal reported back to the club on what percentage of the Ornament sales, if any, should go to the club instead of the charity. The committee recommended that 100% of ornament sales should go to the charities minus expenses from the sales. The club passed a motion to this effect.
- f. Members are encouraged to make Beads of Courage and Wig stands, and charity ornaments. The Board authorized Billy Dodd to pay the \$250 fee for Village Green.

Demonstration By Jon Reiver

The demo was making a wave bowl. Jon explained the process that he goes through to make the bowls, Starting with the layout of the curve to cut on the bandsaw. Then inserting a curved veneer between the two halves. He explained the different methods that he used to make either protruding or recessed rings, After the assembly of the bowl, he showed holding for turning, either a tenon or a recess. Nice demo Jon.
