Safety: Drue Hogland talked about wood attachment to the lathe and asked the group which was a safer method of attaching wood, tenon or recess. As it turns out a recess is safer than a tenon due to grain orientation if the surrounding wood isn't too thin. He also mentioned that wood that contains cracks along the grain line should not be turned due to them coming apart while turning. He said that trees subjected to high winds can cause these types of cracks.

RON OPAT DEMO

Ron explained the steps he uses to construct a Lazy Susan and a Hollow form constructed from scrap wood around the shop. Although he didn't actually turn anything he went thru all the steps and showed the different jigs he uses to put the Lazy Susan together. He explained that the proportions of the top and bottom need to be such that the item doesn't want to tip. His Hollow form was basically a number of scrap woods glued together and then turn on the outside to a desired shape before putting a bottom in the piece. Good job Ron.






