JOHN LUCAS-SANDING AND FINISHING

John did an excellent demo on the art of sanding, removing tear out and finishing. He told how to spot the tear out or scratches by using a light source. A soft light like the sun or the white umbrella hides flaws while a sharp light will show the defects. John discussed the various sandpapers, sanding disks, and abranet. Hard back sanding mandrels are good to start with (courser grits) and soft back mandrels are good for finish sanding (finer grits).

John showed the different methods of power sanding, angle sanders, air sanders and angle drill motors. Also, how to make your own sanding devices like a dowel with Velcro on it.

John showed how to fill a small void or tear out with CA glue and sandpaper.
