John Lucas Demo on Turning & Fluting a Tool Handle

John Lucas gave an informative demo on turning and fluting a tool handle.

Turn or buy a soft metal ferrel.

Drill the hole for the tool in your blank. Typical handle length is 16 inches.

Mount your handle between centers with the hole at the tailstock and turn the thickness for the ferrel at the tailstock end. Use calibers to get the thickness correct. You can use a cone shaped live center.

Make a jig to hold your mini-router. Make a table with guide that fits on your banjo to place the router jig on. (see photos).

Use your built in index system or attach an index system to the headstock end for fluting.

Ensure your router cutter center is at the proper height (dead center). You can use PVC spacers to insure the height doesn't change.

Determine how many flutes to make (8 was used) Make the flutes, ensuring you rotate your lathe the proper number of index holes. Try to start and stop each flute at the same distance along your handle.

Cut a relief at each end of the flutes. Have Fun!


