RON SOLFEST DEMONSTRATION ON MAKING A CHRISTMAS BELL ORNAMENT.

Ron Solfest did a wonderful demo of turning a bell ornament. Ron laminates blocks of wood (sometimes scrap) to make his bells, His preferred glue is Tite Bond ll E. He starts by rounding the bland with a spindle roughing gouge. Then shape the bell with a spindle gouge. Next, drill a hole to your desired depth. Ron recommends the hunter carbide tool for shaping the inside and flatten the bottom. Sand to 320. Reverse chuck the bell. Ron uses the buttons from Cole Jaws and puts them on the chuck. Carefully finish the outside. Drill a hole to accommodate the clapper and mounting string.
