
The Challenge for August is to make somethinh embellished as demonstrated by Ted Pelfrey. There were several excellent entries. The winner was Tom Neckvatal.

28 August 2025

- 2. Old Business:

- 5. Demo was done by Jon Reiver on warping wood. He talked about the effectiveness and mechanics of Steam bending, boiling wood and using Ammonia to bend wood. He received many good hints from the audience. The Challenge for September is something bent. Steam bending or chemicals are not necessary, any bent entry is eligible, for example; Off axis turnings or carved turnings.

Demonstration By Jon Reiver Bending bowls and vases

I built a steam chamber 2 FT by 2FT by 2FT with a vent, drainage holes and 1/4 inch NPS adaptors for the steam source.

Steam Source: Wagner or Earlex Steam Generator 1.3 gallon Rockler or Amazon \$70

They last about 1.5 hours and take a 20 minute warmup time. I used two generators in sequence so the steam source wasn't interrupted.

Boiling the turnings did not seem to work.

Household Ammonia worked after 3 day soak.

Safety:

Steam:

Use a facemask and gloves if opening the chamber.

The steam generators appear to take about 15-20 amps-Not measured. If you run a second load on the circuit, it trips a 20 amp breaker. Must use at least a 12 gauge extension cord to avoid overheating the extension cord.

Ammonia:

Toxic fumes. Avoid breathing fumes and use a well-ventilated space.

Use a container with a lid and use gloves and tongs.

Bending jigs. Still working on applying appropriate pressure to bend piece without cracking.
