THE ART OF INLAYS AND EMBELLISHMENTS

FOUR MEMBERS OF THE CUMBERLAND WOODTURNERS ATTENDED A CLASS BY MYRA ORTON TITLED THE ART OF INLAYS AN EMBELLISHMENTS. THOSE ATTENDING WERE STEVE SULLENTRUP, JOHN STINSON, BOB KOHLE AND THOMAS NECKVATAL. THE CLASS WAS HELD AT THE APPLACHIAN CENTER FOR CRAFTS IN SMITHVILLE TENNESSEE JULY 30 THROUGH AUGUST 4, COVERING MANY FORMS OF SURFACE EMBELLISHMENT OF SMALL TURNED BOXES. TECHNIQUES USED INCLUDED WOOD TURNING, INLAYS, POWER CARVING AND PYROGRAPHY. WOOD USED FOR THE CLASS WAS PROVIDED BY MYRA INCLUDED CHERRY, MAPLE, ELM, POPULAR, HOLLY, WALNUT AND PINE. MYRA, BEING AN EXPERIENCED TEACHER, APPLIED HER EDUACATIONAL EXPERTISE TO THE CLASS, INCLUDING WELL ORGANIZED OUTLINES, FOCUSING ON ACCURACY, QUALITY AND PERSONAL SUPPORT. ATTENDEES WERE AT DIFFERENT LEVELS OF EXPERIENCE FROM BEGINNERS TO EXPERIENCED. EVERYONE RECEIVED THE NECESSARY ATTENTION COVERING TECHNIQUE AND PROPER TOOL USAGE. THE INITIAL TURNING OF THE BOXES COVERED SHAPE PORPORTION AND FINAL DESIGN UTILIZING FIT AND FINISH. ALL ACTIVITIES WERE PREPARATION FOR THE COMING EMBELLISHMENT CHOICES. THE CLASS DAY STARTED AT 9AM WITH LUNCH AT NOON FOLLOWED BY THE AFTERNOON CLASS THEN A BREAK FOR DINNER THEN BACK TO THE WORKSHOP FOR THE EVENING SESSION ENDING AT 8;30PM. THE DAYS WERE LONG, HOWEVER, IT PROVIDED EVERYONE AMPLE TIME TO COMPLETE THE DAYS ASSIGNMENT. ONE BOX PER DAY WAS THE PLAN PLUS A BONUS PROJECT FOR THOSE INTERESTED. MYRA IS A FIRST CLASS WOODTURNER AND EDUCATOR. THOSE WHO ATTENDED THE CLASS HAD NOTHING BUT PRAISE FOR HER AND THE EVENT. IF ANYONE IS INTERESTED IN TAKING HER CLASS IT IS MONEY WELL SPENT.
