JOHN LUCAS DEMONSTRARION OF A NATURAL EDGE BOWL, TOOL CONTROL, AND GRINDS

John Lucas did a wonderful demo of turning a bowl (Demo was natural edge). John explained the process of setting up the blank. He likes to use the between centers method. John explained the various grind angles, 40, 50, and 55 degrees. John uses a very small bevel, 2 to 3 mm. He talked about a very light touch for his finishing cut, shear cuts and negative scrapers.
