














Items in the Instant Gallery at the TAW Symposium

STEVE SULLENTRUP-HOLLOWING THE EASY WAY

Steve did a wonderful demo about hollowing with only three tools, a 5/8" bowl gouge, a ¹/₂" bowl gouge and a parting tool. With the wood mounted on a face plate, prepare the top surface with a hole for a chuck. Mount in the chuck and hollow the inside surface, leaving a flat at the edge for a gluing surface. The same procedure for the lower half except without the hole. Glue the two halves together and blend in the glue joint.
